

CAMPER CODE OF CONDUCT

A full time behavioral specialist or designated member of the health care team to help with behavioral problems is recommended. Every camper meets with the behavioral specialist during registration. Behavioral expectations are reviewed with the camper and their parent/guardian at that time.

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Respect yourself, others, and property – this means respect yourself by keeping your things picked up, your personal hygiene, and taking your medications on time. It also means no fighting, stealing, inappropriate language, harassment, property damage, graffiti or vandalism.
2. Participate in camp activities - It is our responsibility to know where all the campers are at all times. We ask campers to be at all activities unless excused by staff. Campers cannot be left alone in their cabins.
3. Follow directions – There are a lot of fun things to do at camp but every activity has rules so we can operate the activity safely. We ask the campers to follow staff directions while at camp.
4. No put downs – Examples of this would include teasing, name calling, racial slurs, or inappropriate practical jokes.
